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The Guidelines for the Preparation of the Report of Inclusion of a Licensed Study Programme on the Accreditation Form

The guidelines for preparation of the report of inclusion a licensed study programme on the accreditation form of study field (hereinafter - the guidelines) have been developed in accordance with Cabinet Regulation No. 793 of 11th December 2018 "Regulations on Opening and Accreditation of a Study field" paragraphs 2.5. and 13.

The purpose of the guidelines is to provide a structured framework for higher education institutions and colleges¹ for preparation of an application and report (hereinafter – the report) for including a licensed study programme on the accreditation form of a study field. Considering that this procedure is a prerequisite for the inclusion of the study programme on the accreditation form, the following information shall be included in the report:

- the progress of the implementation of the recommendations provided by the expert group within the licensing of study programmes;
- the progress of the implementation of the recommendations provided by the Study Quality Committee within the licensing;
- information to be included in the report in order to evaluate the study programme in accordance with the requirements set out in paragraph 16 of the Cabinet Regulation No. 793.

The guidelines determine the information to be included in the application and report, its structure and form, in order that higher education institutions / colleges could prepare the necessary documents for the assessment procedure regarding the inclusion of a licensed study programme on the accreditation form of a study field. The compliance with the unified guidelines will facilitate the work of both higher education institutions / colleges in the process of preparing the report and experts in the assessment process.

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¹ The term "higher education institution / college" used in this document applies to all higher education and science institutions referred to in the Law on Higher Education Institutions that implement academic and professional study programmes, as well as engage in science, research and artistic creation (universities, colleges, institutes and colleges).

The report shall be prepared as follows:

- in accordance with the sequence set forth in the guidelines, justifying the statements made and providing references and examples;
- in accordance with the literary and grammar rules of the Latvian and English language, legal and academic terminology;
- evaluating the progress since the licensing of the study programme and indicating future plans, projects and perspectives.

If the study programme is implemented in the form of distance learning or in branches, it is necessary to provide an additional analysis in accordance with the specifics of the distance learning study form and / or branches.

The higher education institution / college is obliged to provide only verifiable information and must be prepared to provide evidence and facts during the expert visit that confirm the information that has been mentioned in the report.

The application and report are submitted:

- electronically and signed with a secure electronic signature in accordance with the requirements of the Electronic Documents Law
- in the official state language with a translation in English (translations of documents provided by other organizations may be marked as a "working translation" and do not require a notarization). In case of disagreements, the documents submitted in the official language shall prevail.

After conclusion of the assessment process, the report (without annexes) is published on the E-platform (https://eplatforma.aika.lv).

Document certifying that the higher education institution or college will provide opportunities for students to continue their education in another study programme or another higher education institution or college (agreement with another accredited higher education institution or college) in case the study programme is terminated (*in case information has changed since the licensing procedure*).
- 9. A document certifying that a higher education institution or college guarantees compensation for losses if the study programme is not accredited due to the actions (actions or omissions) of the higher education institution or college or the study programme's license is revoked and the student does not wish to continue studies in another study programme (in case the information has changed since the licensing procedure).
- 10. If a doctoral study programme has been submitted for evaluation, attach a confirmation that the academic staff of the doctoral study programme includes not less than five doctors, at least three of whom are experts approved by the Latvian Council of Science in the field or sub-field in which the study programme intends to award a scientific degree (*in case the academic staff in the study programme has changed*.
- 11. If a doctoral study programme has been submitted for evaluation, attach a confirmation that the scientific and pedagogical qualification of doctors of science complies with the criteria specified in regulatory enactments regarding the evaluation of scientific and pedagogical qualifications of professors and associate professors (in case the academic staff in the study programme has changed).
- 12. If a joint study programme is submitted for evaluation, attach a written agreement with the higher education institution or college involved in the implementation of the study programme regarding the development and implementation of the joint study programme.

If the annexes with the note "in case the information included in the document has changed since the licensing procedure" are not submitted, the higher education institution / college shall indicate that the information to be included in these annexes has not changed since the decision on licensing of the study programme was made.

The samples are recommendable, the higher education institution/ college may submit the relevant information in other form, by ensuring that the information is transparent and easy to use.
